CHILD DEVELOPMENT PUTS FAMILY FIRST

The Children's Collective, Inc. has developed a comprehensive plan to help parents become more engaged in their children's learning environment. Building family relationships is an important part of creating trust and providing quality care for children. The Child Development department provides many opportunities for families to be engaged in and aware of their child's development including parent orientation, parent conferences, Parent Advisory Committee, and volunteering. Recently, each site hosted a Back-to-School Night to showcase the program and the progress children are making. The staff did an amazing job of making this event special for all the parents. They presented information about themselves, the program, and filled the room with samples of the activities the children work on. The parents truly enjoyed learning more about their child's day-today activities in the program.





RITHED EDIVIOLENCES OF GOOD OF GOOD





The FamilySource Center has been "up to a lot of good" since our last newsletter! It has provided more than 600 individuals with non-perishable food items, produce, diapers, hygiene kits and clothing during events such as the Thanksgiving Food Distribution, Holiday Food and Toy Giveaway, and Martin Luther King Distribution. In addition to providing goods and food to the community, TCCI provides Free Tax Preparation services. This free service offered by subcontractor Castillo Tax Services, supports the goal of increasing household income. Not only do we save clients \$200 in tax service fees we are putting hundreds back into their pockets when they are able to claim the Earned Income Tax Credit and the Child Tax Crediit. Finally, the College Corner has facilitated College Readiness Workshops for 15 youth. These workshops will help youth claim money for college, explore career paths and gain life skills that will support future self-sufficiency. When the workshops are completed, each youth will receive a laptop to support their academic journey and will participate in a fun Energy in Motion Workshop hosted by Knott's Berry Farm.

CFILL HOSTS PHYSICAL ACTIVITY TRAINING

This winter the CalFresh Healthy Living (CFHL) Program trained a new batch of CATCH teachers. CATCH is the physical activity/nutrition education curriculum that is implemented by trained teachers at the TCCI Child Development sites. Last year, teachers taught a total of 562 CATCH classes to our young active scholars. With the hard work of our current CATCH certified teachers and the help of our newly trained staff, the program is targeted to surpass this number while promoting fun, physical activity, and healthy eating.

BLACK INFANT HEALTH JOINS BLACK JOY PARADE

On February 25th, the Black Infant Health staff participated in the Black Joy Parade in Oakland, Califórnia. The Black Joy Parade was founded seven years ago to celebrate the Black experience and the Oakland community's contribution to history and culture, with its signature parade, partnerships, and events. Black Infant Health was the core sponsor of the Black Joy Parade. Dressed in golden-yellow sweatshirts, the staff passed out flags to participants, sang and danced seven blocks in Uptown



Oakland. It was a beautiful experience to be a part of the Black Joy Parade and witness the African American community unify to celebrate our blackness, our creativity, our presence, and our freedom. Black Infant Health Service Area 8 will be hosting our Spring Resource and Recruitment Fair on March 22nd at Curtis Tucker Wellness Center. The purpose of this fair is to recruit participants for Service Area 8 and provide the community with information about Black Infant Health and supportive services such as tax preparation, car seat safety training, life insurance, lactation support and many others.
