FILE YOUR TAXES FOR FREE AT FSG

The FamilySource Center's (FSC) February was full of love and care in various forms. FSC's wonderful team of tax representatives and preparers stayed long hours to ensure community taxpayers'

tax returns were filed accurately and timely. These free tax services save taxpayers over \$200 for each successfully filed tax return. Through this initiative, FSC has been able to identify and claim over \$30,000 in tax credits that go right back into the pockets of our community members!

Throughout February, FSC has provided various additional supportive services, including:

 Providing 85 air purifiers to those impacted by the wildfires

 Holding a Black History Month distribution through the program's food pantry, which gave out 75 bags of nonperishables and protein food items


 Supporting 30 households with needed household items such as diapers, clothing, and public transit tap cards.

CALFRESH STARTS PARENT NUTRITION SERIES AT FLORENCE CHILDCARE SITE



In February, the CalFresh Healthy
Living Program (CFHL) began
offering parent classes at TCCI's
Florence Childcare site. The series,
Healthy Happy Families, consists of
eight different weekly lessons and
is designed specifically for parents
of preschool age children. Parents
learn about the nutritional needs
of young children and how to make
healthy changes at home for the
whole family.

Different topics include:

 Parents' role in developing healthy habits in young children

• Growth patterns of preschool children

· Importance of and how to develop beneficial home routines

How to involve kids into mealtime preparation and planning


• Tips for picky eaters and how to encourage positive behavior

 How to develop healthy mealtime habits at home

 How to incorporate physical activity as a family

CFHL health educators, Kat and Citlalli, offer the lessons twice a week. Each lesson includes a cooking demonstration and taste test of a healthy recipe. Some recent tastings include black bean and veggie tostados; mango and black-eyed pea salsa; and green smoothies.

Although the lessons are held at TCCI's Florence site, all TCCI preschool parents are welcome to attend the lessons, which are offered in both English and Spanish. Classes are held Tuesdays at 9am and Fridays at 1:30pm.





Celebrating BLACK HISTORY MONTH



During the month of February, the Black Infant Health (BIH)

program provided a variety of support services to pregnant and parenting mothers. Staff conducted twenty prenatal and postpartum groups where mothers learned about healthy nutrition, setting personal goals, home safety, and how to support a healthy baby.

Three group series were initiated this month and ten mothers successfully completed their sessions. To celebrate their success, we hosted three baby showers. Each mother received various infant and maternal care items that included diapers bags, bottles, pacifiers, baby clothing, safety materials, and diapers. Mothers who completed the postpartum sessions received a postnatal recovery kit with personal care items to support post-delivery hygiene.
