She says it's been amazing to see the kids' confidence grow along with the plants they've helped raised.

FSG EMPOWERS LAS ONE FAMILY AT A TIME

After an eventful program year, the staff at the FamilySource Center (FSC) have come to realize: Our clients' challenges are a result of the inequities placed in our Los Angeles neighborhoods.

The cost of living is rising -- food, rent, and transportation are expensive. Many families in Los Angeles face the dual burdens of unaffordable living and limited access to essential services. However, at our FSC, our clients are getting ahead of today's economic challenges. Families have access to a variety of services such as food assistance, crucial items, and more. They bring home hope and relief after a visit to our center.

Along with our partners at Hurting & Hungry Charites, we have fed over 3,700 individuals through our food pantry and monthly food distributions. Over \$20,000 has been spent on rental units that are now called homes because of the move-in costs and furnishings we have provided. Another \$240,000 kept families in their homes and avoided eviction. Over 2,000 youth can live and grow with the free books, tutoring services, toys, clothing, and diapers we have provided. We have returned over \$500,000 to our clients' income during our tax season! Fifty clients have been able to address their immigration needs with our subcontractor, CARECEN. This means no attorney fees, no risks of being scammed, and no facing pertinent documents alone.

At our core, we are dedicated to empowering individuals through transformative support. Whether it's pre-employment assistance, housing navigation, or providing vital resources and referrals, we are committed to offering comprehensive guidance at every step. Our goal is to ensure that everyone who walks through our doors leaves equipped with the tools and support they need to transform their lives and build a brighter future.

FSC will continue to empower our community and address the issues to alleviate poverty despite the challenges in today's society.



CALFRESH, FATHERS, & FLAVOR

During the month of June, the CalFresh Healthy Living (CFHL) Program partnered with TCCI's Parent Advocate, Joyce Hernandez, in presenting the program's organizational wellness policy to parents. This parent

program's organizational wellness policy to parents. This parent meeting was dedicated to TCCI fathers and hosted a workshop that introduced CalFresh and the wellness policy. Additionally, we highlighted the role fathers have in encouraging healthier eating to their children and reminded them to attend our future parent nutrition classes.

In June the CFHL team also hosted a Rethink Your Drink Day, which included:

- This campaign, which aims to reduce consumption of sugar-sweetened beverages, was hosted at one of TCCI's graduation culminations. The goal was to reach a large group of adults and children and distribute resources and recipes to reinforce the campaign message while providing activities to keep the kidsengaged.
- CFHL educators, Citlalli and Kat, also offered a healthy popcorntastetest for the parents attending the culmination.
- During the culmination events, the CFHL team will also be distributing comment cards that provide parents the opportunity to share feedback on CFHL classes and produce distributions.



BIH WRAPS THE YEAR WITH PURPO

As we finish up this fiscal year, Black Infant Health (BIH) wrapped up their 10th prenatal Sister Circle group where four mothers commenced on June 18th. The mothers received diaper bags full of items necessary for their postnatal journey such as postpartum recovery kits, diapers, wipes, journals, books, and clothing for their bundles of joy.

On Saturday, June 17th, Black Infant Health team members Tara Barnes (program supervisor) and Lena Canyon (family health advocate) participated in the annual Father's Day/Juneteenth baby shower and resource fair at Curtis Tucker Center for Community Wellness in Inglewood, California hosted by Black Infants and Familes. T. Barnes and L. Canyon hosted the BIH table where guests learned about services that BIH offers, distributed materials


including custom mugs, hand sanitizers, journals and water bottles. On June 18th, BIH also hosted an asthma training workshop that was open to all TCCI family members. The event

She earned her Bachelor of Arts in Psychology (with a minor in German) from the University of Texas at Austin in 1968, followed by a Ph.D. in Psychology from the University of California, Los Angeles in 1974. In 2007, she furthered her leadership acumen through the Executive Program in Management at UCLA's Anderson School of Management.



It was during her graduate studies at UCLA that Dr. Kimbrough's passion for improving outcomes for children took root, inspiring her to establish TCCI in July 1972. Since then, her vision has flourished into a vital community institution, empowering generations of families across South Los Angeles.
