And that is what we do every day.

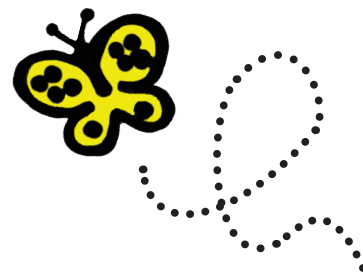

What makes TCCI so spectacular is the love, patience, and care that teaching staff have--not just for my child, but for all children.

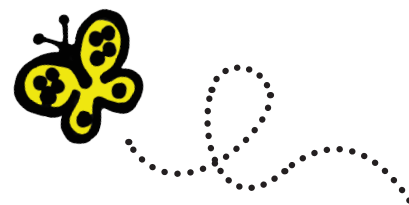


OPEN HOUSE WELCOMES PARENTS

- Our classrooms are designed to meet the developmental needs of infants, toddlers, and preschool-aged children through play-based learning and consistent routines.



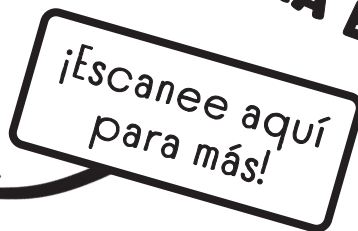

TCCI's FamilySource Center has hit the ground running to start 2026! We have lots of exciting programming scheduled for the new year.

In January, the FSC held a food distribution in honor of Martin Luther King Jr. day.

It was another successful and fun event that numerous community members attended. We distributed bags of fruit, turkeys, chicken, and shelf stable goods provided, once again, by our wonderful partners at Hurting and Hungry.

We carried the new year momentum into our Super Saturday event at the end of January, which kicked off our Free Tax Prep Los Angeles (FTPLA) Volunteer Income Tax Assistance program (VITA). VITA season is upon us and we are excited to share this free resource to qualifying community

members. The FSC is proud to join the Community Investment for Families Department (CIFD) in celebrating

the 10-year anniversary of FTPLA and VITA programs. FTPLA is made possible through the support of the Los Angeles Department of Consumer & Business Affairs and community based non-profit partners, including Koreatown Youth and Community Center and United Way of Greater Los Angeles.



CFHL SHARES WELLNESS POLICY

As the new year begins, CalFresh Healthy Living (CFHL) is focused on sharing our Organizational Wellness Policy with parents to align with their new year's resolutions. Our goal is to extend our impact beyond the classroom and reinforce healthy eating habits at home. The Black Infant Health (BIH) team has been focused on settling into our new space at 1182 W. 24th Street in Los Angeles. While the recent move has been an exciting change, it has also required patience and flexibility from the team. We are grateful to be navigating this transition by supporting one another and working together to create a space that is welcoming, comfortable, and supportive for mothers and their babies.

We were excited to launch four new Prenatal (PN) and Postpartum (PP) Group series in January. To better accommodate

participants, we have also added two additional days during the week, providing mothers with more options to attend group sessions.

To qualify, a pregnant birthing mother must be:

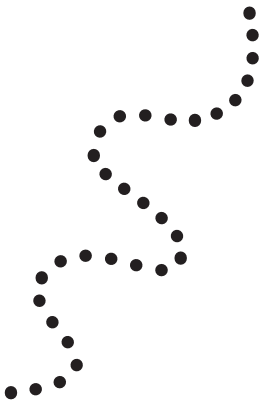
- African American
